#### CHANGES IN RULES.

The following changes were made in the Rules:

Rule two was changed to create:

Three additional positions as Assistant Visiting Ophthalmic Surgeons, thus making the number six.

Two additional positions as Assistant Visiting Oral Surgeons, so making the number four.

A second position as Visiting Roentgenologist.

A second position as Assistant Visiting Physician for Immunology.

Rule three was changed to allow two Visiting Physicians for Neurology, instead of one, to be included as members of the Senior Staff. It was voted that there be two heads of the Neurological Service, although this did not alter the text of the Rules.

Rules regarding the nomination and duties of the Resident Surgeon were altered.

A new rule was made forbidding House Officers to possess a book for the dispensing of liquors.

#### GIFTS AND BEQUESTS.

A legacy of \$5,000 was received under the will of the late Joseph H. Clark. This money was bequeathed to the Hospital for the support of a free bed to commemorate the memory of Dr. Charles Follen Folsom, who for more than twenty-five years served on the Hospital Visiting Staff as Physician to Out-Patients, Physician for Nervous Diseases, Visiting Physician and Consulting Physician.

Three thousand five hundred dollars was received under the will of Ann Maria Fosdick. This, together with the amounts previously received under the same will, form the Fosdick Fund, the income of which is expended to provide special nurses for needy patients.
